The year 2023 has been another milestone in the life of CELDAR Foundation. I thank all our beneficiaries, staff, volunteers, partners, donors, service providers and members of the Governing Board for their great contributions, ideas, and efforts and services that made it possible for this milestone to be achieved. I present to you key highlights and summary of our activities and engagements for the year 2023 as well as partnerships and networks we have joined.

Key among our interventions was our Gender Rights and Empowerment Project which was implemented in 20 schools in the Yilo Krobo Municipality in the Eastern Region of Ghana. Through this project we impacted lives of 500 young girls. We have also supported the Anum community located in the Eastern Region to launch a Community Foundation and a local market project. Through this local philanthropy project, over Sixty Thousand Ghana Cedis was mobilised to begin construction of the community market. We have continued to build financial resilience of micro entrepreneurs in rural communities through financial literacy training and other financial solutions. Under our entrepreneurship and business development program, we have trained over 500 youth in universities and communities. Finally, with support from our donors we were able to develop a five-year strategic and financial sustainability plan for the organisation.

We have continued our commitment to strengthening the civil society space in Ghana. We took active part in the consultations that led to the drafting of the Non Profit Organisations (NPO) bill in Ghana. As the Convener of CSOs Community of Practice on Local Philanthropy, we contributed greatly to the development of a position paper that was presented to the NPO Secretariat. We also Participated in the Ghana Philanthropy Conference where we contributed to the discourse on promoting local philanthropy in Ghana.

Gender Rights and Empowerment Project





1

We have empowered 500 adolescent girls to reduce teenage pregnancy in 20 Junior High Schools through formation of girls' clubs in each school where they are educated on their reproductive health rights.

2

Through this program, a girl who was suffering from sexual abuse by her male counterpart reported and she was rescued. Additionally, two (2) girls who have dropped out of school due to teenage pregnancy returned to school to continue their education.

3

Increased acceptance of adolescent reproductive health services in the 10 communities through community and household outreaches and education by the trained volunteers and peer educators

Youth Entrepreneurship Program

Through our youth entrepreneurship and business development program, we have trained over 600 young people in entrepreneurship including in-school and out of school youth.

We supported 220 startups to register their businesses. We also provide assistance and advice in business management, project management, product design, and regulatory compliance to these micro entrepreneurs

We facilitated capacity building in entrepreneurship and business development for over 300 youth in entrepreneurship and business development

Micro Entrepreneurs Support Fund (MES Fund)

Our Micro Entrepreneurs Support Fund (MES Fund), is a revolving peer to peer fund established with the objective of supporting poor and low-income earners especially women who are operating micro businesses in rural areas to build business capital and financial assets through savings and credit.

In 2023, the fund supported 15 women micro entrepreneurs with an average loan size of GHS 3000.00 to invest in their businesses and pay back. The beneficiaries also benefited from financial literacy training and mentoring. This is reducing the barriers that women face when accessing credit including strict requirements such as collateral, poor or no credit history and so they are rejected by formal financial institutions. This has increased the financial inclusion of women.


